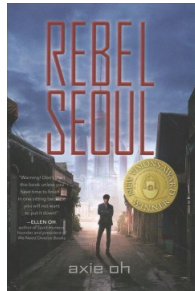


Dystopian Reads for Teens

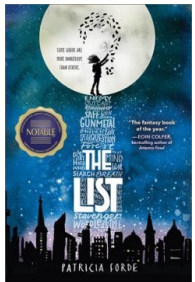


Rebel Seoul by Axie Oh

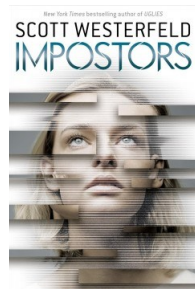
The List by Patricia Forde

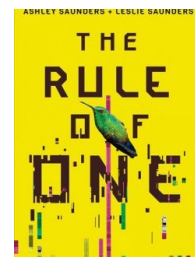
Impostors: Impostors Book 1 by Scott Westerfeld

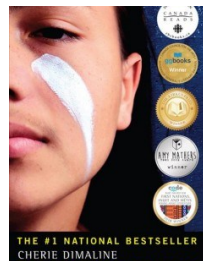
Pacifica by Kristen Simmons

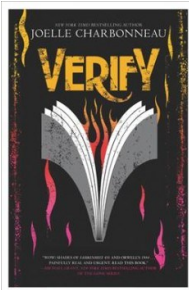
The Marrow Thieves by Cherie Dimaline

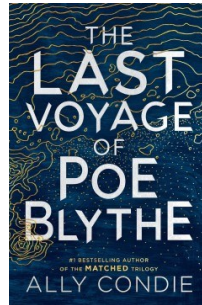
Nine by Zach Hines

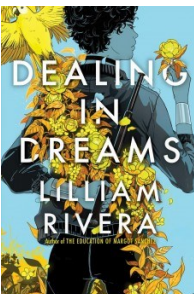
The Last Voyage of Poe Blythe by

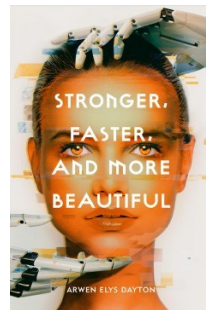
Waning Age by S.E. Groves

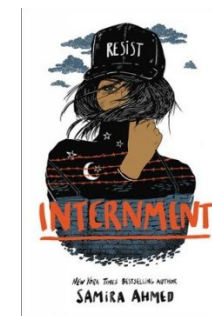
Dealing in Dreams

Six interconnected stories that ask how far we will go to remake ourselves into the perfect human specimens, and how hard that will push the definition of human .



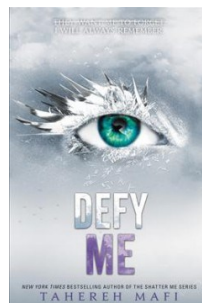
Internment by Samira Ahmed
